As a supporter of arts and entertainment, the Company currently plays music of various genres at its hotel public areas, gaming floors and salons, restaurant outlets, and houses a live band at its Lion's Bar. The agreement will also cover all areas and outlets at MGM China's second property, MGM COTAI when it opens next year.

This signifies an important step toward the goal of safeguarding the interests of local and international music creators in Macau. MACA is currently the sole operating and registered collective management organization founded by a dedicated group of local composers led by Mr. Ung Kuoc Iang. The Association is supported by the International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers (CISAC) and registered in the Macau Department of Identification and the Intellectual Property Department in the Economic Service. MACA was founded to reinforce the public's respect toward composers and authors, and to ensure that their creative efforts are properly remunerated.
